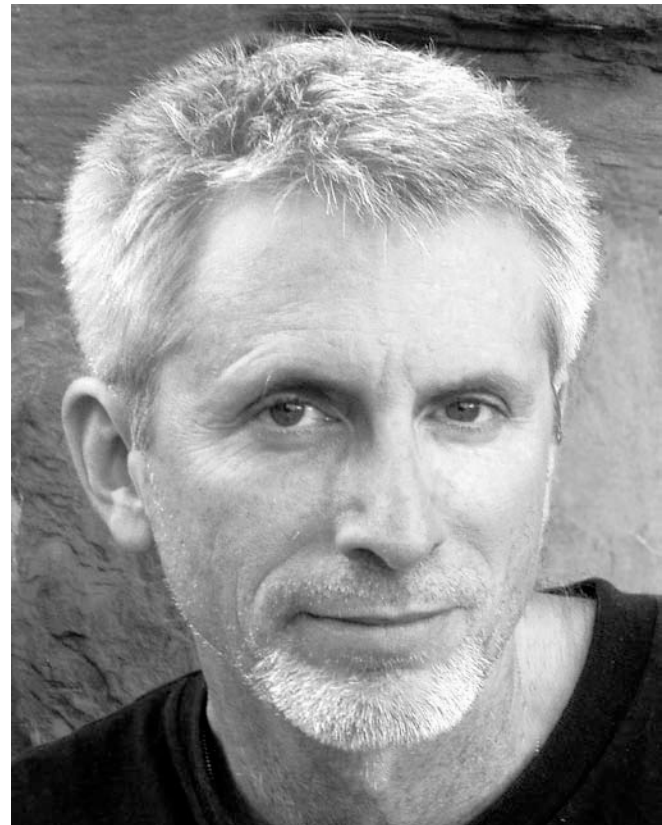


MICHAEL STILLWATER

Michael Stillwater uses music for healing. An author, inspirational educator, award-winning songwriter and recording artist, his music spans genres and defies classification while weaving personal insights with universal principles. Artist/founder of Inner Harmony/Medicine Music, he is creator of *SongCare*, a personalized therapeutic artistry serving individuals, couples and organizations since 1982. Founder and Executive Director of Companion Arts, a nonprofit resource and program provider, he also serves as director of its *Care for the Journey* practitioner renewal program. From his experience with terminally ill patients and their families, the book and recording, *Graceful Passages: A Companion For Living and Dying* was created to meet the spiritual issues of mortality in a respectful, aesthetic way. For this work he and co-author Gary Malkin, an Emmy-award winning film composer, received the Elisabeth Kubler-Ross Award for End of Life Service in 2005. A pioneer in the fields of American folk chant and intuitive song, he facilitates collaborative artistic expression in schools, churches, and communities. An interfaith minister and contemplative retreat leader, Stillwater is an inspiring keynote speaker and performer serving healthcare and faith communities, addressing integrative acceptance, creativity and the cultivation of presence. Married to Swiss psychotherapist Doris Laesser Stillwater, he balances his time between Europe and America.



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
